Please find enclosed the various forms which must be filled out and returned to the Maritime Beef Test Station regarding the 2024-25 Winter Bull Test.

Please return the enclosed forms to the Test Station before October 11th, 2024.

We want to take this opportunity to express our appreciation for your support and confidence in our program at Nappan. Please review the enclosed information carefully. Based on feedback, we expect to have approximately 80 bulls on test and several bulls on the new Bull Development Program. Based on the new fee structure, the Test Fee per bull will be \$1,176.25 + HST and the feed cost will be \$0.06 per pound consumed. The Test Fee will decrease if more than 85 bulls are consigned.

Updated Sale Commission Policy:

The MBTS administers a spring breeding stock sale after the completion of the testing program. The sale is an opportunity for consignors to market animals collectively. To cover the costs of administering the sale, the MBTS shall charge all animals that sell a commission of 10% of the sale price for bulls and heifers. Any animal which does not sell for a predetermined floor price will be charged the cost of cataloguing the animal.

In pursuing the original MBTS mandate: To continue the tradition of unbiased data collection and to remain a not-forprofit business that serves the Maritime Beef Industry

We continue to make changes to our program to improve the testing program, including:

- The Test Fee is \$1,176.25 (\$1,352.69 with HST). Full details are enclosed with the MBTS Payment Memo. A Deposit of \$588.13 (\$676.35 with HST) is required at the time of consignment.
- The MBTS Board is very aware of the cost of performance testing and continues to investigate ways to reduce these costs and pass them along to consignors.
- All fees must be paid before animals are accepted to the Test Program. Animals will not be accepted from consignors with outstanding payables to the MBTS.
- Please check the website for all MBTS policies: www.maritimebeefteststation.ca/policies
- Semen testing will be conducted, and scheduling will be coordinated to maximize the pass rate of bulls.
- If the Test Station office does not receive registration papers for purebred bulls by **February 1**st, **2025**, the <u>bull will be classified as a commercial bull</u> for ultrasound purposes. If registration papers are not received by **March 1**st, **2025**, the <u>bull will not be eligible for the sale</u>. If the Test Station office does not receive sire and dam registration papers for F1 bulls by **March 1**st, **2025**, the bull will not be eligible for the sale.
- The birthdate range for animals consigned to the test will be from December 1st, 2023, to March 1st, 2024.
- The minimum on-arrival weight for bulls will be 700 lbs.

The Maritime Beef Test Station's Annual General Meeting will be held virtually December 4th at 7:00 PM via Zoom as a <u>business meeting only</u>. Please register on the MBTS website. Watch the MBTS social media for winter educational workshops.

PLEASE NOTE:

- (A) The test period will continue to be 112 days in length.
- (B) The adjustment period will be shortened by one week to a total of 11-12 days before the bulls go on-test, versus the previous 18-19 days. This also means the 112-day test period will end one week earlier than usual.
- (C) Bulls entering the test must be born between December 1st, 2023, and March 1st, 2024.
- (D) MBTS staff will try to help coordinate transportation as much as possible. Please call the office, and we will try to assist you with your trucking this fall.
- (E) All cattle must be dehorned upon arrival, and please follow the enclosed health recommendations to help reduce health costs and ensure your bulls and heifers get off to a healthy start.
- (F) All purebred cattle must be tattooed before arrival at the Test Station.
- (G) Please sign and return the enclosed forms to the Test Station.
- (H) Please sign and return the enclosed information by October 11th, 2024. The next group of bulls will be accepted on Friday, November 1st and Saturday, November 2nd, 2024. No animals will be accepted after these dates.
- (I) The program's annual membership fee is \$25.00 + HST (\$28.75) per farm to assist in addressing our financial commitments. The application is included in this package.
- (J) The Test Fee is \$1,176.25 + HST per animal.
- (K) The deposit fee of \$588.13 + HST is due with the animal upon arrival
- (L) All fees are payable before animals are accepted to the Test Program. Cheques can be made payable to the Maritime Beef Test Society. Credit Card payments (Visa, Mastercard, and American Express, plus a 3.5% surcharge will be applied) can be made by calling 902-893-7455.
- (M) A late payment fee of \$100.00 per bull will be charged for entrance payments not received by Nov. 30th, 2024.
- (N) The price structure component regarding vet costs will be in effect again this fall. In an attempt to bring vet costs in line, any vet costs incurred will be charged back to the consignor, with the consignor being notified. Charges will be billed after the test period. This structure was brought into place to combat increasing drug costs and promote proper conditioning of cattle before entry.
- (O) If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact the office staff at 902-661-2855. You can also fax applications to 902-661-0372 or 902-694-9946.
- (P) All cattle must be tagged with a CCIA identification number before entry. The Test Station may apply a tag at the breeder's expense. CCIA tags are to be placed in the opposite ear as the tattoo.

- (Q) Non-purebred (F1 or Upgraded Percentage) bulls will be accepted to the testing program. This means that an F1 bull must have a verified sire and dam of a different breed, and proof must be provided. Upgraded Percentage bulls will be accepted if they are at least ¾ (75%) purebred and registered with their breed.
- (R) All cattle will be dewormed upon arrival and receive an on-arrival BRD drug, such as Zuprevo.
- (S) A Reproductive Physical Exam will be performed on the bulls, and the cost will be charged back to the consignor. A reproductive physical exam is a prediction of a bull's potential reproductive capacity based on selection criteria. Selection criteria include a physical examination for abnormalities, examination of the genital organs, libido evaluation, and scrotal circumference measurement. Examining bulls for breeding soundness allows the consignor to identify bulls that are potentially poor breeders and allows them to improve fertility rates in their herd. The cost of the reproductive physical exam is included in the Testing Fee.
- (T) Semen Testing will be performed by the Atlantic Veterinary College on all bulls, and the cost is included in the Testing Fee.
- (U) Ultrasounds will be done on all bulls, and the cost is included in the Testing Fee. If the Test Station office does not receive registration papers for purebred bulls by February 1st, 2025, the bull will be classified as commercial.
- (V) Fecal samples will be collected from all bulls and used, along with the Green Feed system, to measure methane output for a research project with Dalhousie Faculty of Agriculture.
- (W) A small fee (\$10.00) is charged to the consignor, which goes into a compensation fund. Please see the MBTS Compensation Fund Guidelines for more information.
- (X) If registration papers for purebred bulls are not received by the Test Station office by March 1st, 2025, the bull will not be eligible for the sale. If sire and dam registration papers for F1 bulls are not received by the Test Station office by March 1st, 2025, the bull will not be eligible for the sale.
- (Y) Bulls are required to be pre-weaned and bunk ready.

This additional funding is being utilized in the program's administration and provides financial resources to fund our Annual Meeting and dinner. Changes such as these are made in an attempt to recover costs that we are unable to continue to provide to our clients. We hope you understand our current position and will continue to support our endeavours and ensure that we continue to maintain our role in the further development of our Beef Industry.

Active: Every Maritime Producer of beef cattle who pays annual membership dues will be eligible to be a member of the Maritime Beef Testing Society. Everyone who tests animals at the Test Station must be a member of the Society.

<u>Associate Members</u> Membership on a non-voting basis is open to all those persons, companies, institutions, etc., who are not actively engaged in the production of beef cattle.

Please complete the provided form and return it to our office with your entry form. The \$28.75 (incl. HST) payment must be made at the time of entry.

As a member of the Maritime Beef Testing Society and consigning animals for performance testing, you agree that the data collected during the testing program is owned jointly by the Member and the MBTS and that any data accessed, processed or otherwise submitted to third parties, including National Breed Associations can be released without condition, to the MBTS.
