We want to take this opportunity to express our appreciation for your support and confidence in our program at Nappan. Please review the enclosed information carefully. **Based on feedback, we expect to have approximately 75 bulls and 25 heifers on test.**

Sale Commission Policy:

The MBTS administers a spring breeding stock sale after the completion of the testing program. The sale is an opportunity for consignors to market animals collectively. To cover the costs of administering the sale, the MBTS shall charge all animals that sell a commission of 10% of the sale price for bulls and heifers. Any animal which does not sell for a predetermined floor price will be charged the cost of cataloguing the animal.

Sale selection and sale order are based on the Global Index ranking.

In pursuing the original MBTS mandate: ***To continue the tradition of unbiased data collection and to remain a not-for-profit business that serves the Maritime Beef Industry***

We continue to make changes to our program to improve the testing program, including:

- The MBTS Board is very aware of the cost of performance testing and continues to investigate ways to reduce these costs and pass them along to consignors.
- A 50% deposit of the total entrance fee [per animal] for bulls and heifers is required at the time of consignment. See Payment Information section for additional details.
- All fees must be paid before animals are accepted to the Test Program. Animals will not be accepted from consignors with outstanding payables to the MBTS.
- Please check the website for all MBTS policies: www.maritimebeefteststation.ca/policies
- Semen testing will be conducted, and scheduling will be coordinated to maximize the pass rate of bulls.
- If the Test Station office does not receive registration papers for purebred bulls/heifers by February 1st, 2026, the bull/heifer will be classified as commercial for ultrasound purposes. If registration papers are not received by March 1st, 2026, the bull/heifer will not be eligible for the sale. If the Test Station office does not receive sire and dam registration papers for F1 bulls/heifers by March 1st, 2026, the bull/heifer will not be eligible for the sale.
- The birthdate range for animals consigned to the test will be from December 1st, 2024, to March 1st, 2025.
- The minimum on-arrival weight for bulls will be 700 lbs, and for heifers will be 600 lbs (must be open).

The Test Fee will be as follows:

- **Bulls: \$1,111.18 + HST per bull, with an estimated feed cost of \$378.00** (based on the estimate of 6,300 pounds consumed at \$0.06 per pound, variable by bull). The Test Fee will decrease if more than 75 bulls are consigned.
- **Heifers: \$650.00 + HST per heifer, feed included****

***The Climate Adaptation Leadership Program (CALP) will be subsidizing the heifer test this year to provide an incentive to consign to the first RFI heifer test at MBTS. This is intended to be a one-time subsidy for the 2025-26 test.*

PAYMENT INFORMATION:

- Half of the total entrance fee must be paid by the time the bull or heifer arrives at the Test Station. This covers all Test fees, aside from feed and vet visits (if required):
 - Bulls: A 50% deposit of the total entrance fee is now due, in the amount of \$633.37 (\$555.59 + HST) per bull.
 - Heifers: A 50% deposit of the total entrance fee is now due, in the amount of \$370.50 (\$325.00 + HST) per heifer.
- Payment methods: cheque, made payable to the Maritime Beef Test Society, credit card (Visa, Mastercard, and American Express; a 3.5% surcharge will be applied) made by calling 902-893-7455, or email money transfer to mbts@agricommodity.ca.
- Cattle entries will only be accepted by breeders who do not have an outstanding balance with the Maritime Beef Test Station.
- All producers who enter a bull or heifer must be a member of the Maritime Beef Testing Society; the fee is \$28.50 (\$25.00 + HST). The application is included in this package.
- A late payment fee of \$100.00 per head will be charged for entrance payments not received by November 30, 2025.
- A \$150.00 per head payment is due by February 1, 2026. This deposit will be counted towards your final billing.
- Bulls/heifers of owners with outstanding account balances will not be eligible for the 2026 Breeding Stock Sale.

DUE DATES THROUGHOUT TEST PERIOD:

- **On Animal Arrival:** 50% Entrance fee due (50% of test fee), per head
- **Oct. 31st (until 3:30 PM) and Nov. 1st, 2025:** Bulls and heifers accepted
- **Nov. 30, 2025:** \$100.00 per head late fee, charged if entrance fees not yet received
- **Feb. 1, 2026:** \$150.00 per head deposit towards final bill
- **Feb. 1, 2026:** Registration papers deadline (or classed as Commercial for ultrasound)
- **Mar. 1, 2026:** Registration papers final deadline (or not sale eligible)
- **Mar. 1, 2026:** Consignor footnote deadline, for sale catalog (maximum 250 characters)

PLEASE NOTE:

- (A) The test period will continue to be 112 days in length.
- (B) The adjustment period will be shortened by one week to a total of 11-12 days before the bulls and heifers go on-test, versus the previous 18-19 days. This also means the 112-day test period will end one week earlier than usual.
- (C) MBTS staff will try to help coordinate transportation as much as possible. Please call the office, and we will try to assist you with your trucking this fall.
- (D) All cattle must be dehorned upon arrival, and please follow the enclosed health recommendations to help reduce health costs and ensure your bulls and heifers get off to a healthy start.
- (E) All purebred cattle must be tattooed before arrival at the Test Station.
- (F) **Please sign and return the enclosed forms by October 10th, 2025.** Bulls and heifers will be accepted on **Friday, October 31st (until 3:30 PM) and Saturday, November 1st, 2025.** No animals will be accepted after these dates.
- (G) The price structure component regarding vet costs will be in effect again this fall. In an attempt to bring vet costs in line, any vet costs incurred will be charged back to the consignor, with the consignor being notified. Charges will be billed after the test period. This structure was brought into place to combat increasing drug costs and promote proper conditioning of cattle before entry.
- (H) All cattle must be tagged with a CCIA identification number before entry. The Test Station may apply a tag at the breeder's expense. CCIA tags are to be placed in the opposite ear as the tattoo.

- (I) Non-purebred (F1 or Upgraded Percentage) bulls and heifers will be accepted to the testing program. This means that an F1 bull/heifer must have a verified sire and dam of a different breed, and proof must be provided. Upgraded Percentage bulls/heifers will be accepted if they are at least $\frac{3}{4}$ (75%) purebred and registered with their breed.
- (J) All cattle will be dewormed upon arrival and receive an on-arrival BRD drug, such as Zuprevo, as well as treated with FerApease.
- (K) A Reproductive Physical Exam will be performed on the bulls and heifers. A reproductive physical exam is a prediction of an animal's potential reproductive capacity based on selection criteria. Selection criteria include a physical examination for abnormalities, examination of the genital organs, libido evaluation, and scrotal circumference measurement (for bulls). Examining bulls and heifers for breeding soundness allows the consignor to identify bulls/heifers that are potentially poor breeders and allows them to improve fertility rates in their herd. **The cost of the reproductive physical exam is included in the Testing Fee.**
- (L) Semen Testing will be performed by the Atlantic Veterinary College on all bulls, and the cost is included in the Testing Fee.
- (M) Ultrasounds will be done on all bulls and heifers, and the cost is included in the Testing Fee. **If the Test Station office does not receive registration papers for purebred bulls/heifers by February 1st, 2026, the bull/heifer will be classified as commercial.**
- (N) Additional samples may be collected to support local or national research efforts. These may include fecal, tissue or blood samples. When possible, collection will be done while bulls and heifers are already being handled for routine testing measurements to reduce impact on the bulls or heifers.
- (O) **If registration papers for purebred bulls/heifers are not received to the Test Station office by March 1st, 2026, the bull/heifer will not be eligible for the sale. If sire and dam registration papers for F1 bulls/heifers are not received by the Test Station office by March 1st, 2026, the bull/heifer will not be eligible for the sale.**
- (P) Cattle are required to be pre-weaned and bunk ready.
- (Q) Sale selection and eligibility will be based on Global index score, as well as semen results, bull temperament, and yearling weight. Global index score will also determine sale order.

Membership

The Annual Membership Fee of \$25.00 (two members per farm) will be paid at the time of entry. This membership entitles any Maritime Beef Testing Society members to have a voting privilege on Test Station business. Membership will be strictly adhered to at meetings. In order for members to actively vote on issues, they must be in good standing with the Society for the current year. This additional funding is being utilized in the program's administration and provides financial resources to fund our Annual Meeting and dinner. Changes such as these are made in an attempt to recover costs that we are unable to continue to provide to our clients. We hope you understand our current position and will continue to support our endeavours and ensure that we continue to maintain our role in the further development of our Beef Industry.

Active: Every Maritime Producer of beef cattle who pays annual membership dues will be eligible to be a member of the Maritime Beef Testing Society. Everyone who tests animals at the Test Station must be a member of the Society.

Associate Members Membership on a non-voting basis is open to all those persons, companies, institutions, etc., who are not actively engaged in the production of beef cattle.

The \$28.50 (incl. HST) payment must be made at the time of entry.
